STUDENT WORKER INTERVIEW GUIDE

Below is a sampling of questions to be used during your interview with the student worker. Most of these questions apply across all departments. Select 3-4 questions relevant to the position and use the same questions for each student you interview for a particular job.

General Questions:

- 1. Upon reviewing the job description, what interests you most about this position? And why do you feel you are a good fit for the job?
- 2. What skills do you have that will make you successful in this position? What skills would you like to learn?
- 3. What has been your biggest accomplishment to date?
- 4. What have you done to pursue your own professional development?
- 5. Describe a time you felt that a situation was unfair. What did you do?
- 6. How do you show others that you respect their cultures and beliefs.
- 7. What are your greatest strengths and what areas do you feel you need to develop?

Customer Service:

- 1. What does great customer service mean to you?
- 2. Tell me about a time you had to deal with someone that was irate, how did you handle this situation.
- 3. Give an example of a time you went above and beyond, why did you do it? Any regrets?
- 4. How do you know when you have truly met someone's needs?

Communication:

- 1. Tell me about a time you had to adjust your communication style to accommodate the style of another? What was the outcome?
- 2. How have you shown that you are a respectful listener? What have you done to show that you care about what others have to say?
- 3. Describe a time you had to present an idea to others, this may include students, co-workers etc.
- 4. Describe a time you had to communicate difficult information to someone. What was the situation and how did you communicate what needed to be said?
- 5. What do you think is the most important part of communicating?

Accountability/Initiative:

- 1. Give me an example of a time you took on more work than what was required of you to make an improvement.
- 2. Tell me about a time you were given a task to complete but you did not have the tools necessary to complete the task. What did you do?
- 3. Tell me about a time you came up with an innovative solution to a problem.
- 4. Tell me about a time you exceeded your goals. What about a time when you missed your goal. What happened?
- 5. Tell me about a time you made a mistake on the job. How did you remedy it?
- 6. Not all parts of a job are fun or challenging. What tasks fall into this category for you and how do you motivate yourself to complete these tasks?

Teamwork/Leadership:

- 1. Did you ever have to rely on people to complete a project or solve a problem? What was the situation? How did it turn out?
- 2. Give me an example of a time when you had to work closely with people to accomplish a goal and you stepped up to lead. How did it go?
- 3. Have you ever led a committee or group? What was your role as the leader? What were the challenges?
- 4. Describe a situation when you were part of a team that was not working well together. What did you do? What did you learn from it?
- 5. Do you feel you are a better individual contributor or a team player? Which do you prefer and why?

Technological Literacy:

1. Tell me about the technology you currently use and what you feel your proficiency level is.
